

If you are still hoping to participate in Spring Postings, remember that as a TTOC you are considered a P4 (Priority 4), which means that your application will be considered after colleagues who are P1-P3. You are welcome to apply on postings in the spring rounds, but don't be disappointed if you don't get a call to interview – it's not because you aren't a good candidate, but rather that they had other candidates with higher priority who they are required to consider first. In the summer there will be some additional positions posted – those have far fewer P1-P3 applicants, so you are much more likely to interview and be successful on those postings! You will receive information about the dates and process for those postings from Human Resources.
